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The text of the abstract should be written in Times New Roman 11 point font, with 2.5 cm margins on all sides, line spacing 1.15. Any captions or figures in the graphics must also be in an 11 point font to ensure legibility. Please limit the formatting to a minimum, and make sure that all fonts are embedded in the file. Do **not number** the pages.

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Parenthetical references (Jones 2011, 238), or Jones (2011, 238), and references at the end of the abstract must follow *The Chicago Manual of Style*, Author-date system (available at http://www.chicagomanualofstyle.org/tools_citationguide.html).
